# ALL IS NOT WELL, AS ANXIETY SWELLS

Experts see rise in cases of anxiety \* Negative news, distress on social media makes it worse

Mental health experts say they are seeing an increase in cases of anxiety across age groups since the last month. A large part of this they attribute to the negative news surrounding the virus, but also exposure to distressing messages of those seeking urgent medical help for their loved ones on different social media platforms.

City-based psychiatrist Dr. Harish Shetty said that there is extreme anger against the establishment, which could lead to tension and violence. Shetty is also seeing anxiety among young children (6 to 15 years), who are having panic attacks and are unable to sleep. He said that the TV coverage of the pandemic is causing this. The elderly, on the other hand, believe that they will die. He said the general sense of panic is hundreds of times more than during the first wave. The trauma could pass on to the next generation, with intergenerational sharing of trauma, such as events

like the partition. "The effects will be very long term," he opined.

Psychologist Arti Shreef said that this time around, people feel the virus is closer to home, with those in their close circles getting infected. The mental health of those with pre-existing mental illnesses has worsened as well. Moreover, they see heated exchanges between parents and become emotionally unstable. The pandemic-induced frustration is also making couples behave differently with each other, she said. Many partners do not know how to handle the situation, which leads to quarrels and misunderstandings.

Mental health helplines are seeing a greater number of calls in the past month. Dr. Nishu Shah of Man Samaritans helpline that operates in Maharashtra said that the helpline receives more calls relating to COVID-19 and vaccinations. "People are angry with authorities for not being able to get beds or injections. The anger is reflected in their calls," he said. Another helpline provider, that operates in Mumbai, Kolkata and Bangalore, has witnessed double the number of calls since March 15. "People between 20 and 40 years of age, Bhishad Khurana, head counsellor at the helpline, said the constant exposure to grief and negativity is making one feel low and sad even if they are not directly affected by the virus.

We don't need any compensation, but we could at least get our deposit back," said Sayed Shuja Abbas son of Sayed Rehan.

# BMC distributes ration kits to transgenders and sex workers

The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), with the help of NGOs on Tuesday, distributed essential items and ration kits to 4,500 commercial sex workers (CSWs) and members of the transgender community in its jurisdiction. BMC officials said that the distribution of ration kits is part of the civic body's initiative to support CSWs hit due to pandemic induced lockdown.

The initiative was started by the BMC's planning department. Civic officials said that under this initiative, with the help of various NGOs, around 4,500 transgender and CSWs in the jurisdiction of BMC were provided with ration kits containing various daily essentials. "There are about 4,500 CSWs and transgender community members in the city. As these women



are facing various difficulties during the current lockdown, the planning department of the BMC has taken the initiative to distribute food kits with the help of various NGOs," said Sangeta Hasnale, Assistant Municipal Commissioner - Planning Department.

The initiative was launched on Tuesday by an additional municipal commissioner (eastern suburbs) Ashwini Bhide, an additional municipal commissioner (city) Sanjeev Jaiswal, in the presence of BMC corporator Javed Juneja at Savitribai Phule Municipal School in NM Joshi Marg.

Hasnale added: "The kit we distributed includes items like rice, flour, sugar, salt, salt, red chili, turmeric, gram, onions, potatoes, edible oil, body soap and laundry soap. We distributed this kind of ration and essential kits during the lockdown last year too."

# PMC allows mini Covid care facility at hsg societies, NGOs

In order to ease on the existing pressure on the COVID Care Centre, the Panel Municipal Corporation (PMC) has allowed housing societies and NGOs to set up a small COVID Care Facility by following the guidelines.

However, only asymptomatic patients and those with mild symptoms of COVID can be treated at such mini centres. Amid the rising number of COVID cases, the existing facilities are falling short under the Panel Municipal Corporation (PMC) area. In the prevailing situation, the civic chief Sudhakar Deshmukh allowed housing societies and NGOs can set up small COVID Care facility.

The facility might be separate from the society building like the community centre that has separate washroom and entry and exit. In addition, the facility must have been created under the guidance of civic body with proper monitoring like CCTV cameras or security guard. In addition, there must be an ambulance facility to ferry patients in case the health conditions deteriorate. "Children below 12 years, senior citizens, and lactating mother cannot be treated at such facility," said a senior civic official from PMC's Health Department.

A Shiv Sena shakhsamukh has lodged a complaint with the police alleging that assistant of BJP corporator Krushnaveni Reddy had put up his WhatsApp status message, an objectionable edited photograph of Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and NCP



Supreme Sharad Pawar with the intention to hurt sentiments of people. The said person was arrested by the police later. Last year, a prominent Twitter user Sameer Thakkar was booked under the charges of obscenity and defamation after he called Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray - Aurangzeb and his son and fellow minister Aditya Thackeray as "baby penguin".

According to the Wadala TT police, complainant in the case is Vitthal Patil (60), a resident of Wadala (E). Patil had been working as Shakhsamukh for ward number 171 since 2015. Patil in his complaint with the police alleged that, on April 26, while he was walking to

wards his home he received a message on one of his WhatsApp groups in which it was mentioned that Reddy's assistant Gangaprasad Gajula (30), had put a edited photograph of CM Uddhav Thackeray and Sharad Pawar as his WhatsApp status message. The said photograph was allegedly objectionable in nature. A screenshot of the said status message was shared in Patil's group.

Patil then approached the police and got a complaint lodged in this regard. The police have registered a case against Gangaprasad Gajula under sections 295A (Deliberate and malicious acts, intended to outrage religious feelings of any class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs)
